St. Matthews Picks New Police Judge

The St. Matthews City Council last night accepted the resignation of Police Court Judge Gilbert Flack and named attorney David L. Proffitt, 162 Thierman Lane, to succeed him.

The change will become effective on approval of Governor Chandler.

Councilmen said Flack intends to move from St. Matthews. His term has about two years to run.

A past commander of the Zachary Taylor Post 180, American Legion, in St. Matthews, he served in the Army during World War II. This week he was inducted into the Masonic Lodge in St. Matthews. At his church, Beargrass Christian, he is a deacon.

He and his wife, the former Blanche Pauline Lecompte of Shelby County, have one child, Pamela Lee, 11, a Stivers sixth grader.

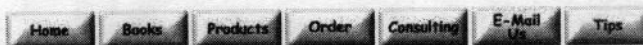

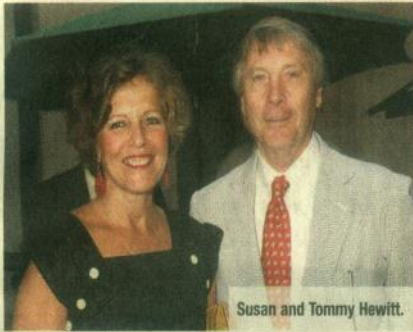
